2025 LEGISLATIVE NOTES By Kody Kyriss, SDATAT Lobbyist

The second to last week of the 100th legislative session is complete. While it was certainly quieter for your Association leadership and I, we spent most of the week monitoring the funding for rural access infrastructure fund bill and advocating for its passage accordingly.

Your Association leadership and I have continued to follow bills that may have interest to your Association and its members. **SB 169**, An Act to require that taxing districts hold a public hearing when increasing property tax revenues compared to the previous year, has been sent to the House floor with no recommendation and waits for a final disposition next week.

Additionally, **HB 1218**, An Act to prohibit certain political subdivisions from imposing firearm restrictions on the county, municipal, and township employees, officers, and volunteers has been amended to address concerns such as a meeting taking place in a courthouse and passed Senate Local Government with a vote of 5-2. It now awaits a final disposition on the Senate floor.

Additionally, it should be noted that a significant landowner rights bill – **HB 1052** – was signed into law. This bill prevents the use of eminent domain for carbon pipelines.

Finally, your Association has been monitoring the property tax reform legislation that has been moving throughout the legislature. Your Association has remained neutral on **SB 216**, the Governor's

bill, but testified in opposition to **SB 191** out of concern that it would result in more taxes for political subdivisions such as townships.

As stated previously, your Association continues to prioritize **SB 95**, funding for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund. SB 95 passed the Senate floor with 2/3rds majority this week and has been moved to the House awaiting action. However, in discussing the bill with various representatives, they are still waiting for final numbers from appropriations to determine how much, if any, they can give to requests such as SB 95 and the rural access infrastructure fund. It is currently scheduled for the House floor vote on Monday, March 10, 2025. I would strongly urge all of you to reach out to your local representative and ask for their support for SB 95 prior to Monday afternoon.

We are about to head into the final week of the 2025 legislative session. While we are hopeful of additional funding for the rural access infrastructure fund, we do not know what the legislature will ultimately decide to do next week. Regardless, know that your Association did its best to voice your concerns during this legislative session. As we wrap up this legislative session and look forward to the 2026 legislative session, the best thing you can do is respectfully express your concerns to your local senator and representative.
